Norman John Endorf, 84, of Tobias, passed away on September 12, 2014 at The Hearthstone in York, NE. He was born January 3, 1930 to Henry and Edna Bartels Endorf on a farm two miles east of Tobias. He was the second son of four boys.

Norman was baptized at Zion Lutheran Church, rural Tobias, on January 26, 1930 by Rev. William Nau. He attended Zion Lutheran School through 8th grade. Norman was confirmed on April 18, 1943 by Rev. C.F. Schrien. He graduated from Western High School in 1947.

Norman was united in marriage to Betty Holtmeier on January 7, 1951 at Zion. God blessed this marriage with two sons, Gaylen and Glen. Norman was in the Marine Corps from 1952-1954 and served in Korea. When his service was completed, he returned to his family in rural Tobias and farmed with Betty. Over the years they had a dairy herd, hog operation, and fed out cattle along with the field work.

Norman enjoyed carpentry in the off season, mostly working with vinyl siding. He and two local farmers, Galen Niederklein and Leroy Rohr sided many homes in the neighboring towns for a number of years.

He served many years on various church boards and also the Tobias Town Board.

Norman was preceded in death by his beloved wife Betty of almost 58 years, his parents
