JOSEPH JAMES KADERABEK WAS BORN TO LOUIS AND AGNES KOCA KADERABEK ON AUGUST 11, 1933 AT HOME IN OHIOWA, NEBRASKA AND PASSED AWAY AT FILLMORE COUNTY HOSPITAL OCTOBER 21, 2013 AT THE AGE OF 80 YEARS OLD.

JOE MOVED FROM OHIOWA TO A FARM NORTH OF OHIOWA AT THE AGE OF FOUR, WHERE HE LIVED THE REST OF HIS LIFE. JOE ATTENDED COUNTRY SCHOOL AT DISTRICT #39 THROUGH THE EIGHTH GRADE THEN WENT TO HIGH SCHOOL IN OHIOWA GRADUATING WITH THE CLASS OF 1951. AFTER GRADUATION JOE ATTENDED AND GRADUATED FROM MILFORD TRADE SCHOOL, TAKING UP AUTO BODY.

JULY 13, 1955 JOE WAS DRAFTED INTO THE ARMY WITH BASIC TRAINING LOCATED AT FT. CARSON, COLORADO. JOE THEN WENT TO ABERDEEN PROVING GROUND SCHOOL IN ABERDEEN, MARYLAND FOR HEAVY ARTILERY SCHOOLING. FROM FEBRUARY 1956 TO JUNE 1957 JOE WAS SENT TO FORMOSA. THEN IN SEPTEMBER OF 1957 JOE RE-ENLISTED INTO THE ARMY. JOE WENT BACK TO SCHOOL AT ABERDEEN PROVING GROUND, IN ABERDEEN MARYLAND FOR

AMMUNITION TRAINING IN WHICH HE WAS CERTIFIED IN GUIDED MISSILE PROPELLENT EXPLOSIVES. HE WAS SENT TO FORT SILL, OKLAHOMA FOR ONE YEAR. THE COMPANY WAS MOVED TO WHITE SANDS, NEW MEXICO WHERE HE HELPED MIX FUEL FOR THE FIRST RED STONE MISSILE. JOE WAS DISCHARGED IN JUNE OF 1960 AT THE RANK OF SARGEANT AND RETURNED HOME WHERE HE BEGAN FARMING AND IN THE WINTER MONTHS DROVE TRUCK TO THE WEST COAST AND DOWN TO TEXAS.

JOE MARRIED SHIRLEY TUREK ON OCTOBER 7, 1961, IN MILLIGAN. THEY LIVED THEIR ENTIRE MARRIED LIFE ON THE FAMILY FARM. THEY ADOPTED THREE CHILDREN KEITH LOUIS, JOSEPH GEORGE, AND DEBRA DARLENE. ASIDE FROM FARMING, JOE ALSO OPERATED A DIRT MOVING, FERTILIZER SPREADING AND TREE SHEARING BUSINESS AND RAISED LIVESTOCK. HE ALSO WAS A SEED DEALER FOR MANY YEARS, MOST RECENTLY FOR PRODUCERS HYBRIDS. HE ENJOYED SPENDING TIME WITH HIS CHILDREN AND GRAND-CHILDREN, CAMPING, PLAYING CARDS, GARAGE SALING, CHRISTMAS DECORATING AND VISITING WITH FRIENDS. JOE WAS PRECEDED IN DEATH BY PARENTS LOUIS AND AGNES KADERABEK, BROTHER-IN-LAW WARREN WESTON, NIECE KATHY WESTON, SISTER-IN-LAW BONNIE BEEKMAN, AND BROTHER-IN-LAW WILLIAM "BILL" ZALESKY. JOE IS SURVIVED BY WIFE SHIRLEY, SONS KEITH (ANGIE) KADERABEK OF DAYKIN, JOEY KADERABEK OF MILLIGAN, DAUGHTER DEBRA (BRENT) COLLIER OF CROOKSTON; GRAND CHILDREN HEATHER, HAILEY AND HARLEE KADERABEK OF DAYKIN, ALLISON AND RILEY COLLIER OF CROOKSTON; SISTER MARY ANN WESTON OF LINCOLN, NIECES NANCY (STAN) BUTTERFIELD OF LINCOLN AND PHYLLIS (TERRY) BESTA OF ARIZONA; SISTER-IN-LAW DARLENE ZALESKY, NIECE LISA (DAVID) MALY AND NEPHEW B.J.
