



Lawrence J. Webb

February 25, 1929 - August 2, 2013

Lawrence J. Webb was born to Dewey F. Webb and Margueriete (Murphy) Webb in Tecumseh, Nebraska on February 25, 1929. After a long and happy life with his wife, Darlene F. Webb of 59 years, Lawrence passed away at his home on August 2, 2013. L.J. grew to an adult in Tecumseh, Nebraska where he was an outstanding student and athlete in football, basketball, and track (president and captains in high school). Later, he attended Peru State College on a track scholarship and graduated with a Bachelor of Science degree in 1951. The same year, he was drafted in the Army. This was the start of the Korean War. Webb was a Cryptography Specialist and rose to the rank of Sergeant with an honorable discharge in November 1953. Reliability and adherence are only a couple of the qualities that he gained from his experience in the Army. These qualities were reflected in his later days as a partner, a friend, a husband, and a father. After being discharged from the Army, he came back to work for the Nebraska State Highway Department for 8 years and rose to the rank of engineer. After this in 1961, he worked for Maury Corporation for 8 years where they built box culverts and bridges. This led to the beginning of his own business that we know today as L.J. Webb Contractor. A solid and well deserved man with 40 years of creating jobs and friendships among the community. He met his wife, the former Darlene Goracke, after being in the Army and together they raised a family of boys, Michael, Robert and William. Robert married Elizabeth Miller and brought to Larry yet another role in his life, as a grandfather to Austin and Jill Spurling, and Patrick and Andrew. Lawrence is also survived by his brother Kenneth and sister-in-laws Denise and Virginia. L.J. is now joined in death with his mother Margueriete, father Dewey, brothers William, Richard, James and sister-in-laws Patricia and Rosemary. Not only did he love to be around his family but all the many friends as well. Some of his favorite activities included playing golf and going to sporting events. But he did enjoy his alone time, as any wise man would. On occasion, he enjoyed puffing on his tobacco and drinking drambuie with his coffee watching movies and sports in his home basement. L.J. once was known by his young grandnephew as “the man that drives around in that red pickup and lives in the basement.”

L.J. became well known because of what he gave to his community. Giving was in his nature. Webb was a member of St. Joseph’s Catholic church, Association of General

Contractors (honorary life member), American Legion, VFW, National Rifle Association, University of Nebraska Foundation & Touchdown Club and the Alumni of Peru State College.

Larry's day life became very busy, but he never missed a nap or a good rest. He always made plenty of time for his soul to know his belonging in the unknown world to come. He knows it now in his final rest. Thank you for your thoughts and may we all be blessed.

Funeral services were conducted from the St. Joseph's Catholic Church in Geneva, Nebraska, on Thursday, August 8, 2013, with Father Edwin Stander. Organist Nancy Jo Galusha provided prelude and postlude music. Guitarist and Vocalist Karl Brinkman sang "Precious Lord, Take My Hand", "Amazing Grace", "Wind Beneath My Wings" and "On Eagle's Wings".
