April 10, 1935 - July 24, 2020

Norman Leo Yound was born to Emmett Yound and Myrtle Simnit Yound on April 10, 1935, in Brantford, KS, and passed away on Friday, July 24, 2020, in Lincoln, NE, at the age of 85 years, 3 months and 14 days. He was the oldest of three children.

Norm attended and graduated from Washington Kansas High School in 1954. On April 3, 1955, Norm married Carol Elaine Johnson, and to this union six children were born.

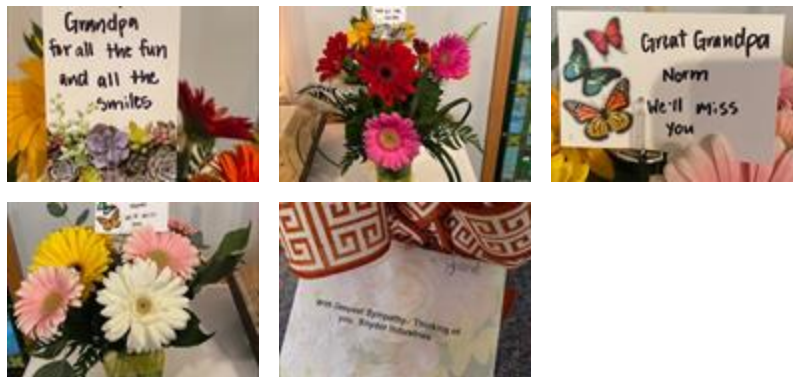
